My Dear Friends,

The current situation with Covid 19 , as you know, is changing on a daily basis. With every News Conference, our lives change, people lose jobs, the way we live our lives change. Our country and indeed the world is in crisis. This is a challenging time for all of us . Let us take this time, especially if you are restricted to your home, to come together as a family – in prayer and solidarity with one another. Let us respond to what is happening right now with love and charity in our hearts. A lot of people are going through so much , having lost so much. Continue to keep them all in your prayers as I will continue to keep you all in my daily prayers.

Our young children especially would be so frightened and confused of the changing world around time. People in face masks, people restricted to their home, roads in some areas almost deserted, not being able to do their “Normal thing during the holidays”. If we are scared of the situation, what must they be feeling. Let us ensure that we are there to support them during this time, remind them that God is still here for them and will continue to be here for them.

At this time, as you know, as directed by the Federal Government, Church's are to remain closed for the time being. I know that a lot of you feel that the church should remain open for private reflection, but we do have to comply with the Governments directive. We have to be mindful that the majority of our congregation are vulnerable to this virus and we should as a community do our best to protect them by complying with what is asked of us. In view of this, I encourage you to set a time with our family each day, to pray. “For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.” Perhaps this simplicity in the practice of our faith, will allow us to reconnect with Christ in our fast-paced and ever more changing and secular society.

We are currently exploring ways in which we can bring you a digital daily mass, and as soon as we come up with a solution, we will advise the community of the outcome. If any of you would like to participate in a daily mass, please let Fr Jerald or the Parish Office know. We will however continue, as long as possible , to upload weekend masses and especially Easter Reflections. Keep a lookout for these on our website.
