The Easter story is a story of overcoming darkness and despair, and finding new life and hope. because we know that suffering produces perseverance;

because God's love has been poured out into  
our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

In addition to watching the liturgies streamed online, we encourage you to make these few simple acts during Holy Week.



## Holy Thursday

- Read John chapter 13:1-17 and take turns washing each others feet
- Consider taking down wall art in your home to create a bare space
- Share bread and wine/juice and read the story of the last supper



## Good Friday/Holy Saturday

- Implement some silence in your home throughout the day, in the morning or during the 3 o'clock hour
- Fast not only from food but other noises such as music/tv/social media



## Easter Sunday

- Celebrate! Read John chapter 20:1-9
- Get dressed up and make a wonderful meal to share as a family
- Call/FaceTime with loved ones

# HOW TO PRAY MASS FROM HOME



## CREATE A SACRED SPACE

- Set out a crucifix
- Light a candle
- Open your bible to the Gospel reading
- Rearrange furniture

## PREPARE SPIRITUALLY

- Dress the same as you would if you were attending Mass
- Bless the room with holy water
- Have each person bless themselves with holy water
- Spend a few minutes in silence before Mass begins

## ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE

- Stand, kneel, and sit at the right times
- Say the prayers and responses of the Mass out loud

## ENGAGE IN COMMUNITY

- Share a meal after Mass
- Spend time talking about the Gospel reading
