Resumption of Weekday Morning Mass

From 11:59pm on 31 May 2020 restrictions on gatherings at places of worship and ceremonies will be eased:

- Places of worship can open for private worship or small religious ceremonies for up to 20 people in a single undivided indoor space, subject to the four square metre rule plus the minimum number of people reasonably required to perform the service or ceremony.

In view of this, with effect from Tuesday the 2nd of June, 20 parishioners will be allowed at our morning masses. **There will now no longer be the need to register your attendance** . You will still however need to sign the attendance list for contact tracing purposes and will still need to adhere to the social distancing rules . We also ask , that if you are feeling unwell to please keep safe at home and do not attend. These masses will still be available on Zoom as normal. At this point in time, weekend masses are still suspended.
